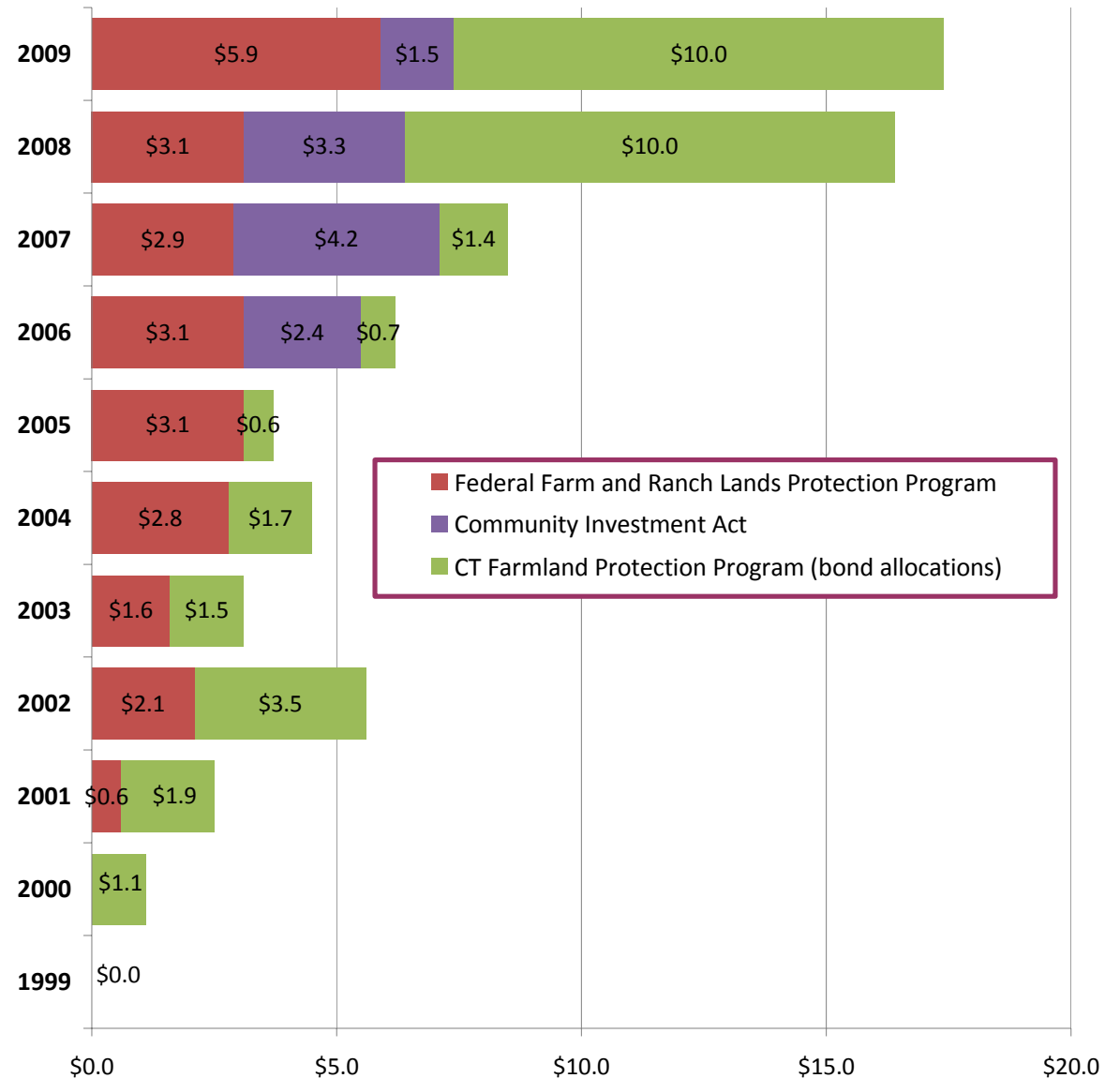


A Decade of Progress for Farmland Preservation in Connecticut

Data in chart reflects major sources of public funding for farmland preservation in Connecticut: federal funding from the federal Farm and Ranch Lands Protection Program by state fiscal year + cash receipts from deed-recording fees through the Community Investment Account by state fiscal year. Federal and state fiscal years are not the same; there is a 3 month gap between the beginning of state fiscal year and the beginning of the federal fiscal year. Additional funds raised by towns, land trusts, and private sources is not included.
